Camborne, ON – Flood Watch

The Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority (GRCA) advises that a second rain storm is set to impact southern Ontario this week. The combination of high water levels will increase the likelihood of flooding and erosion along shorelines. Please find attached the most current [Notice from GRCA](#).

At this time, we ask that Hamilton Township residents living close to the shorelines should take precautions to protect their property from damaging waves and flooding. River and stream outlets are also affected by high water levels, which could result in minor flooding around their shorelines. It is also recommended to monitor any sump pump systems you may have to protect your basements from flooding.

The public and especially children are warned to stay well back from the shorelines of lakes and the outlets of streams near the shorelines to avoid hazards associated with shoreline flooding and erosion.

Conservation Authority staff will continue to monitor water levels and weather forecasts, and provide updates as necessary. Should anyone have questions or concerns and wish to report flooding, contact GRCA staff at 905-885-8173.
